9) List each of your main characters. Label each as either flat or round; briefly explain your answer
10) Could any of your characters be considered foils? Explain your answer.
11) List each character and briefly describe his/her motivation.

12)	Considering the situation, can you empathize or sympathize with the characters? Explain.
13)	What is the overall tone of the story? Explain your answer.
14)	List the types of conflict that appear and give an example of each from the story.
15)	List the types of irony present and explain their use.
16)	List and explain any examples of foreshadowing that you find.
17)	List the symbols that are important and explain what they represent to the characters and/or reader.
18)	Give an example of external dialogue. Give an example of internal dialogue.
19)	List and explain the theme(s) of the story.
20)	Consider cause and effect. What actions in the story lead to the final result? List at least three.
